## fact sheet

coParenter is an app that supports the justice system by giving families the following tools to resolve conflict and not depend on courts for all their disagreements:

- ❑ GetHelp gives parents access to a live, on-demand coParenter Professional to help resolve parenting issues in real time to reduce conflict and litigation
- ❑ Messaging and language filters to keep conversations more business-like and child-centric
- ❑ CheckIn helps with accountability for pickups and drop-offs
- ❑ Requests allow parents to make requests for changes to the already established parenting schedule without using outside resources
- ❑ YourTeam supports diverse families by allowing them to include multiple caregivers and additional family members who help out with the kids
- ❑ SoloMode allows for one parent to use coParenter and have access to all of its features, even if their coParent does not want to participate

Other features include expense tracking, document library, payment and money transfers, kids info bank, educational content and more

## Introducing coParenter to Litigants

coParenter requires access to a smartphone -  
both Android or iOS phones work

### Introduction:

We have a new tool that helps reduce conflict and address disagreements in real time, which will benefit both you and your kids while going through this process.

- coParenter is an app that helps both parents respectfully communicate with each other.
- You can use it to share information about your kids.
- You can use it to keep track of your schedules.
- If you have an issue or disagreement, coParenter can help you work it out together, or you can work with a live, on-demand coParenter Professional.
- The app works a bit like Uber or Lyft - either of you can request help and a Professional responds to the request.
- You can check in for exchanges and use it to make requests of each other, helping keep the focus on your child/children's needs.
- If you are represented by attorneys, they can also work with you to use coParenter through the Your Team feature, where family members can be added as well.
- The app's subscription fee is \$12.99 per month, with the option to purchase a discounted annual subscription of \$119.99. Two annual subscriptions can be purchased, one for each parent, for \$199.99 per year.
- There is a 30 day free trial with every new subscription.
- The app can be downloaded from Apple and Google Play app stores.

**THE COURT MAKES THE FOLLOWING ORDERS AFTER STIPULATION**

1. Petitioner/Respondent(circle one or both)shall enroll on the coParenter platform by \_\_\_\_\_ p.m. on \_\_\_\_\_(date). Petitioner/Respondent shall comply with all coParenter enrollment requirements including supplying accurate information; current phone number and email to coParenter.
2. The parents shall remain continuously enrolled in coParenter until further order of the Court or youngest minor child of the parties reaches majority.
3. The parents shall use coParenter as their primary mode of communication utilizing all available features on the coParenter platform including, but not limited to, accessing GetHelp as a means of resolving their parenting decision disputes.
4. The parents shall enable the 'alert' feature on coParenter and shall log in and check/respond to a coParenter alert within a reasonable period of time.

5. Parties are ordered to daily logins on their coParenter accounts.
6. Except in the event of a true emergency, the parents shall use coParenter as the principal means of documenting all information related to health, safety, welfare and education of the minor children.
7. The parents shall post within a reasonable period of time relevant information pertaining to the minor children.
8. The parents shall liberally construe their obligation to use coParenter in good faith.
9. If a parent uses coParenter to transmit a PDF or photograph, or any other document as defined by **[Evidence Code 250]**, the party posting the document acknowledges that the posted document is a true and correct copy of the document and it has not been altered from the original unless expressly noted at the time that it is posted.
10. Limited access to non-confidential coParenter communication is granted to attorneys of record, court-ordered custody evaluators, or such other persons specified by the court or specifically agreed upon by parties and/or their attorneys of record.
11. The parents shall communicate in a civil, non-harassing, respectable manner through coParenter. If there is a Criminal Protective Order (CPO) or Domestic Violence Prevention Act (DVPA) restraining order, the proper use of coParenter as ordered by the Court shall not be a pro se violation of either the CPO or DVPA Protective Order.
12. The court accepts the stipulation of the parties that printouts from coParenter properly authenticated by a party may be received into evidence without further foundation or objection.
13. This order was served upon the parties directly or indirectly either through attorneys of record or the clerk of court in open court on the date it was signed. The court finds that the parties have knowledge of this order and the ability to comply with its terms.
14. The parties are reminded that a willful violation of this order may be punishable as contempt of a lawful court order.
